

Never before has it been so easy to tackle tall work.

The Little Giant MXZ makes replacing lights and performing other ceiling-height work in auditoriums, gymnasiums, racquetball courts and churches a simpler, far less time-consuming project. The inconvenience and expense of scaffolding or power lifts are, at last, no longer necessary.

A giant of a ladder.

The MXZ comes in five sizes: 13', 15', 17', 19', and 21'. The 13' size allows a 6' person (with arm extended) to reach as high as 18'. And remember that's in the middle of the room. The 15' size would

allow the same person to reach 20'. The 17' version would allow a reach up to 22'. The 19' version would allow a reach up to 24' and the 21' version would allow a reach up to 26'.

No other A-frame ladder can match that height capability.

But perhaps the MXZ's real beauty is its "fold-down" size. The MXZ 21' stores in just 11'8" by 3'9" by 7 3/4". (Shorter sizes of the MXZ have even smaller "fold-down" sizes.)

That makes moving through tight hallways and narrow doors a cinch compared to scaffolding and other large ladders. Obviously, set-up goes a lot faster as well.

Saves money as well as time.

While the MXZ eliminates the need for scaffolding or power lifts, it also eliminates the exorbitant costs of renting these items too.

That can easily mean savings of more than \$100 a day. If you do much "tall work" at all, the MXZ will shortly pay for itself.

Safety is a strong point.

Cost efficiency and convenience aren't the MXZ's only selling points. When properly used, the MXZ is also safer than any typical heavy-duty industrial ladder. Here's why:
